
HAWORTH... is a fascinating village to visit. Bleak and atmospheric on a damp winter's day, yet bustling and colourful in the summer sun. Outwardly, little has changed here since the day in 1820 when the Reverend Patrick Brontë brought his wife and six children to live in the Georgian Parsonage, now the Brontë Parsonage Museum. Here, three of the Brontë girls, inspired by the austere yet beautiful moorland countryside, wrote some of England's best loved novels: 'Jane Eyre' by Charlotte, 'Wuthering Heights' by Emily and 'The Tenant of Wildfell Hall' by Anne. The steep walk up the old cobbled Main Street to the Parsonage and Haworth Church is a treat, with its host of specialist shops, pubs and tearooms. Also not to be missed is the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway, a five mile single track line running from Keighley to Oxenhope complete with vintage steam engines.

This is walking country, and an excellent starting point is




Penistone Hill which affords fine views in all directions across the rugged heather moorland that has come to be called Brontë Country. East Riddlestone Hall, Cliffe Castle Museum and the Keighley Bus Museum are all close by and well worth visiting.

On approaching the village pass Haworth Railway Station on the right, then follow the road (Bridgehouse Lane) around the bend. We are just at the bottom of the hill on the right & are well signposted & illuminated. Turn right into Belle Isle Road & find our car parking at the rear of the cottage.
